THEME

POSSIBLE: Creating the Future, by Reimagining a New Normal

Youth Pastor Summit (YPS) is a conference designed to motivate, inspire, and equip every leader who invests in the lives of the next generation. YPS is a unique experience where there is an intentionality towards creating and cultivating an environment that **fosters collaboration, community, and soul-care**. YPS is a great opportunity for leaders to be refueled, recharged, and refreshed!



This year at YPS we want to help leaders create a better future for themselves while reimagining a new normal! If most leaders were honest, they would suggest, the years before the COVID-19 pandemic, their lives were full of distractions within a chaotic world. In Brent Crowe's new book, *Ten Steps to Your Best Life (2021)*, He stated, "Though things seemed in control, we were lacking a joy of accomplishment, the courage from pushing through the unknown into the beautiful, and the wonder of walking down an untraveled road to a new destination. We sought refuge in the safe confines of what we knew, what was familiar. Then, everything changed!"

Therefore, we want to highlight 8-Central ideas and challenge leaders to discover what is **POSSIBLE**:

1. Main Word: God

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to create a rhythm of renewal by confidently clinging to the idea that God's provision for our lives is God's presence in our lives

2. Main Word: Words

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to let the Word of God shape your words that come from your mouth. "Lord, set up a guard for my mouth; keep watch at the door of my lips" (Psalms 141:3)

3. Main Word: Rest

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to discover a healthy and life-giving rest cycle. Busy doesn't mean productive! How are you managing your rest cycle?

4. Main Word: Relationships

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to learn how to practice the art of relating well with others. What role do relationships fulfill in the life of a Christ-Follower?

5. Main Word: Attitude

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to calibrate the mentality of your heart. There is an attitude that precedes every action. Our attitude has potential for Good and Bad.

6. Main Word: Worthiness

a. Statement: It's POSSIBLE to construct a moral vision for your future. When we understand our worth, we are more willing to empathize with others. You matter to God and your church/school/organization.

7. Main Word: Integrity

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to maintain your integrity, even when others around you are not maintaining theirs. "If we are ever to live our best lives, we must commit to walking in the light of truth every day, in every conversation, with every post on social media, and every use of our resources" (Crowe, 2021, p. 178).

8. Main Word: Contentment

a. **Statement: It's POSSIBLE** to submit and delight in the desires of the Good Father! "When I am content, my relationships are healthier, my attitude is right, and my future moral vision is Godhonoring" (Crowe, 2021, p. 203).


GENERAL INFORMATION

This church has multiple campuses in the Dallas area so make sure you go to the Prestonwood location at the address above. Is YPS really only \$15?
