Inverse: The Counter Cultural Teachings of Jesus

Youth Pastor Summit (YPS) is a conference designed to motivate, inspire, and equip every leader who invests in the lives of the next generation. YPS is a great opportunity for leaders to be refueled, recharged, and refreshed!



This year at YPS, the theme for **YPS 2024 is INVERSE**. *Inverse simply means, "something that is the opposite or reverse of something else."* When Jesus spoke, His teachings were the inverse of what culture was and is saying. It was the opposite of what we would assume to be true. **This year we will explore some of the most challenging and controversial teachings of Jesus**. One of the most common truths that have regularly been applied to the person of Jesus is the fact that **He comforted the afflicted and afflicted the comfortable**. Yes, Jesus said and demonstrated the most loving, accepting, and grace-filled things. However, He also taught complicated truths that even perplexed the people who knew Him best. Why? Because **Jesus taught both grace AND truth!** So, if we want to have the power to truly change our lives and this world, learning how to navigate the tensions between Jesus' teachings on grace and truth is essential. Therefore, during **YPS 2024**, we will highlight four counter cultural claims made by Jesus, as it relates to **Unity, Love, Compassion, and Submit to the Calling**

Is YPS really only \$15?

We think families are great and time together is important. However, this event is **only for those who are 18 and older** and who have graduated high school. We want everyone to have the best experience possible at this event, so please make arrangements to leave your children at home or arrange childcare outside of the conference.

Can I transfer my ticket to someone else?

If you are registered as a group, we will do a one-time transfer of any of your participants, without penalty. Transfers are not available on individual registrations. This one-time transfer must occur a minimum of ten business days before the event.
