## SLU 401 2025 Greece Schedule

June 4, 2025 - SLU 401 GREECE BEGINS! Depart from USA on an overnight flight to Thessaloniki, Greece.

June 5, 2025 - INTO THE FOOTSTEPS OF PAUL: Arrive in Thessaloniki. Meet with our guide and transfer to the hotel. Dinner and overnight in Thessaloniki.

June 6, 2025 - THESSALONIKI/KAVALA/PHILIPPI: Begin the day traveling to the riverbank to the site of Lydia's baptism, the first baptism on European soil. Next, stop in Philippi, where Paul preached his first evangelical sermon and sowed the seeds of Christianity. Among the ruins located on the rocky ledge above the town's main road is the prison into which Paul and Silas were thrown. Next, travel to the port of Kavala, where Paul landed with his disciples, Timothy and Silas. This port was also a destination for Luke the evangelist when he sailed from Troas. See a Byzantine castle, the Roman Aqueduct, and the ruins of an acropolis. Follow the Via Egnatia, a remnant of Rome's highway system, viewing Roman and Greek tombs. Late lunch in Kavala. Return to Thessaloniki, where Paul planted a church that would later receive two New Testament epistles. Dinner and overnight in Thessaloniki.

June 7, 2025 - THESSALONIKI/KALAMBAKA: In the morning visit one of the most beautiful basilicas in the city, St. Demetrius and spend time in the ancient city of Thessaloniki. Explore the ruins of the Roman Forum and see the Rotunda. View the triumphal Arch of Galerius and continue along the waterfront to the massive White Tower. Next, travel south to view the awe-inspiring rock formations of Meteora and Mt. Olympus. Take in the striking monasteries of Meteora that seem to hang in the air, crowning the summits of these pinnacles with their wooden galleries and corniced rooftops. Dangerously hanging over the stunning abysses, these primitive dwellings compose one of the most fascinating sites on earth. A special treat awaits with a visit to one of these timeless monasteries to see the exquisite specimens of Byzantine art on display. Dinner and overnight in Kalambaka.

June 8, 2025 - METEORA/THERMOPYLAE/ATHENS: Journey through the amazing countryside, taking in the beauty of Greece. Stop at the mountain pass of Thermopylae, the location where the Greeks victoriously fought for their freedom during the Greco-Persian wars in 480 BC. See the statue of Leonidas, king of the Greek city-state Sparta. In the afternoon, continue to Athens, the birthplace of democracy. View the world-renowned Acropolis and wonder at the glory of the Parthenon, built 2400 years ago. Gather at Mars Hill, where Paul addressed the

intellectual men of the most informed city of the time, pleading for the cause of Christianity. Dinner and overnight in Athens.

June 9, 2025 - ATHENS/LAVRIO/MYKONOS: Begin the day with a drive to the Port of Lavrio and step aboard The Celestyal Discovery to start a 4-day Greek Islands cruise. All SLU cabins are outside cabins. Spend the afternoon exploring the Island of Mykonos, world-renowned for its lovely windmills, small cobblestone streets, and countryside. Return to the ship for dinner and overnight. Lunch included onboard.

June 10, 2025 - EPHESUS, TURKEY/PATMOS, GREECE: Step off the ship at Kusadasi and into nearby Ephesus, Turkey, Asia Minor's greatest archeological site. This Greek and Roman city has been remarkably preserved. Step along the broad marble where Paul walked. Gaze at the Temple of Artemis (Diana), the Temple of Hadrian, and The Celsus Library. Marvel at the massive theater where Paul was opposed for speaking boldly about Christ. In the afternoon, enjoy cruising aboard The Discovery to the island of Patmos, built on a mass of volcanic rock. The island marks the site where the apostle John was exiled. Visit the Monastery of St. John and the cave where he received the vision he recorded in the book of Revelation. Return to the ship for dinner and overnight. Lunch included onboard.

June 11, 2025 - RHODES: Spend a full day on the island of Rhodes, the largest of the Dodecanese islands, rich in history. Journey to Lindos, where it is believed the Apostle Paul had a short stay on his way to Jerusalem. Visit the Acropolis of Lindos, prominently displaying the Doric Temple of Athena, built in 300 BC with a stunning view of the sea below. See the Church of the Virgin Mary containing frescoes from the 15th century. Return to the capital to be immersed in the history of the occupation of the Knights of Saint John during the Crusades. Pass under the imposing Gate d'Amboise and walk along the Street of the Knights. The crests which identified their Order and living quarters are still visible today. View the aweinspiring Palace of the Grand Master of the Knights of Rhodes, built in the Gothic style. Enjoy free time before returning to the ship for dinner and overnight. Lunch is included onboard.

June 12, 2025 - CRETE/SANTORINI: Arrive in Crete, the largest of the Greek Islands and the cradle of the Ancient Minoan Civilization. This island is where the Apostle Paul spent time as he was being transported to Rome as a prisoner and where Titus remained to help the churches. Take a leisure walk tour through Heraklion, the capital of Crete, and enjoy shopping and local culture. Board The Discovery for an afternoon cruise to the famous island of Santorini, formed by the half-submerged crescent of a volcanic caldera. Perched atop high cliffs, savor the island's breathtaking views from Oia. Dinner and overnight on the ship. Lunch included onboard.

June 13, 2025 - CORINTH: Early morning arrival in Athens to begin the day's excursion. Proceed to Corinth through the Bay of Salamis and the Saronic Gulf. This city was home to the apostle Paul for over a year and inspired two of his most familiar letters. Gaze at the temple of Apollo towering above the remains of the influential metropolis. See the ruins of the agora and the shop believed to be where Paul stayed with Aquila and Priscilla. Marvel at the bema where Paul stood before the proconsul, Gallio. In the afternoon, return to Athens and enjoy a free late afternoon to explore the historical neighborhood of Plaka at the foot of the Acropolis. Stroll along the narrow roads, peruse the quaint shops, and find refreshment at one of the many taverns. Dinner and overnight in Athens.

<u>June 14, 2025 - ATHENS/USA</u>: Transfer to Athens airport for your return flight to the USA with your heart full of memories from spectacular views and unforgettable experiences.

**NOTE**: Schedule is subject to change due to various factors and the SLU's discretion.

# **Travel/ Flight Questions**

## Do you have any suggestions for booking a domestic flight?

For domestic flights, we suggest a minimum of **4 hours** between domestic and international flight times on the outbound and **2.5 hours** on the return.

## Is it possible to book my own flight?

Yes, but it is your responsibility to meet up with the group on June 5, 2025. If you have flight delays or are unable to meet the group at the scheduled time, travel arrangements and costs associated with meeting up with the group will be your responsibility. You will be sent a contact number one month before the trip in case you need to reach someone while traveling.

## Do you have any flying tips for SLU 401?

- If your flight is delayed, or if you have an emergency on the travel date, you can contact our SLU 401 launch team at your designated airport or our Orlando office at (888) 260-2900. You will be emailed your airport contact person's information one month before the trip.
- For sleeping on the flight, try Dramamine, Advil or Tylenol PM, or Benadryl with your doctor's permission.
- Make sure you eat the meal provided by the airlines before you land.

## What about possible travel security issues?

Remember that SLU doesn't *send* your child on these trips; we *take* your child. We would never risk your child's safety or our own. We actively watch for updates from the government on security issues or concerns. We are prepared to adjust the schedule as needed. Also, all travelers should consider registering at <a href="https://step.state.gov/step">https://step.state.gov/step</a>/ through the US Department of State as it allows them to better assist you should an emergency arise either at home or abroad.

## Do you post social media updates on the trip?

For security reasons, neither SLU staff nor SLU participants are allowed to post on social media while on the trip until we have left a location.

## **Dress Code, Packing Tips, and Money**

## What type/amount of luggage should I bring?

Bring ONE piece of checked luggage. Although the airline allows two, we don't have room on the bus for more than one per person. Also in hindsight, many participants wished they had packed a size up on their suitcase, so they had more room for souvenirs. In addition to your large suitcase, you can bring one carry-on / backpack as you will need this for traveling on the bus each day. Pack any medications, toiletries, and a change of clothes in your carry-on in case your luggage arrives later

than you do. Go to www.tsa.gov for up-to-date information as this ruling is subject to change.

#### Why is there a dress code at SLU?

SLU strives to set students up in such a way that they will have the confidence and wisdom to walk into any room whether now or in their future and be prepared for whatever is before them. We believe that how you present yourself is a vital part of that. The dress code is not meant to put a negative light on the students' experience, but to help train each one of them on the importance of dressing modestly and appropriately for whatever situation they are about to walk into.

## What is the dress code for 401?

- Usual SLU rules apply Dress modestly you will be required to cover legs and shoulders on days when visiting religious sites (our guides will give us instructions per day). Additionally, we will be hiking around most of the trip so it is simple – wear something that you can do a lot of walking in. In general:
  - Jeans are fine for everyone (but may be too hot for the climate)
  - Long shorts (touching the knee) are fine in most situations for guys except at religious sites, but ladies' knees <u>must be fully covered</u> during the entire trip (unless on the cruise ship), so pack calf-length capris instead of shorts.
- T-shirts that do not have slogans are great (you never know how your logo or slogan will be interpreted internationally, so it is best for it to have no writing on it at all). Shirts need sleeves and to fully cover the front and back of your body.
- No flip flops or sandals without a back strap are permitted during SLU 401. There will be LOTS of walking every day in a variety of conditions (climbing over rocks, dusty roads, etc.), so think about the shoes you bring. We recommend a good pair of tennis shoes or hiking sandals with a back strap (like Teva's or Chaco's...but if you get those make sure you break them in before the trip). Think: In what shoes can I ride horses, climb mountains, navigate rocks, walk for miles uphill and down, not twist my ankle in, and walk quickly?
- There will be a pool on the cruise ship that you can enjoy in the evening as our schedule allows. Ladies, please pack a modest one-piece bathing suit.
- Pack light! Think in terms of two tops for one bottom. Only take items you truly need. Too much stuff can be a burden on your trip. Pick out what you think you need and cut it in half.
- Those who do not adhere to the dress code will miss out at certain sites as these are the site's rules, not SLU's.

### **General Packing Tips:**

- Tips from SLU Staffers on what they pack:
  - Guys: I generally just get away with packing a mix of shorts and hiking pants for the trip. It is hot, so I make sure everything is breathable. I pack one pair of hiking sandals or tennis shoes. The sites that require guys to wear pants are spread throughout the trip (and I don't want to wear pants all day) and so the hiking pants that zip from shorts to pants are great. One year, I made the mistake of just packing shorts, and I

- missed out on some great opportunities because of it. Finally, a good hiking hat that covers the back of the neck is a must.
- **Ladies:** I made it through the trip with packing all calf-length capris, modest short-sleeved tops, one very cool hiking hat ⊕, and one good pair of Chaco's. Then, I also pack one ankle-length skirt (or pants are good too) and a long-sleeved cover up (or large scarf) that can go in my bag for the days we are at certain holy sites. This allows you to cover up when you need to without being in clothes that are too hot.
- Roll your clothes rather than folding them. Many travel experts agree that rolling is superior to folding. Tightly rolled clothes take up less space and are less likely to wrinkle.
- Put a dryer sheet or two in your suitcase. Not only are they very light, they will also keep your clothes smelling fresh.
- It will be hot, hot, and did we say, hot? Hats are a good idea; sunglasses and sunscreen are essential!
- As always, if you are in doubt, don't bring it! You don't want to miss an important occasion or site because of your dress.
- Essentials that you must pack for the trip: sunscreen, a good hat (have you noticed we mentioned this a couple times), sunglasses, your Bible and pen – you will be taking lots of notes!
- Small snacks that fit in your bags are great: peanut butter crackers, almonds, and energy bars are really helpful between meals.
- A good book or games for the bus; we have a couple days we are driving quite a bit.
- The rolls of travel toilet paper can be a lifesaver or just a roll from your house half full (not too big to carry with you). Bathrooms don't always have toilet paper, so always make sure you have toilet paper and hand sanitizer in your baa.
- Pack your sense of adventure! Trying new food, having new experiences, and meeting new friends in Greece is half the fun!

## Vhat about changing money, and how much money do we need to bring?

- Money for water is essential bring at least 120 Euros for drinks, souvenirs. and emergencies. Bottles of water can be purchased on the buses each day and our staff usually go through 6-8 bottles a day.
- While credit cards are accepted in most places, some of our shopping will take place at special local venues and booths where you may feel more comfortable using cash instead of credit cards.
- The currency is the Euro. Money can be changed at your US departure airport (if you have time) at the currency exchange or sometimes at your local bank in the US. It is important to bring some of your money in small bills. You will not get a good deal if people see larger currency.

#### Vould you use a debit card overseas?

ypically, our staff does not do this since sometimes banks put a hold on the money 1 your bank account for a couple of days. Even though some debit cards can be ised as a credit card, our staff choose to use "credit card only" cards and only used nose for some serious souvenir shopping. Before your departure, be sure to alert our credit card company that you will be using your card overseas. For others, you

## Outside of my registration fee, what other expenses should I plan for on this trip?

- **Flight:** If you select one of the designated flight paths provided by SLU (includes specific domestic departure cities), your roundtrip international airfare is included in your registration. However, it is your responsibility to arrange transportation to and from this domestic departure city.
- SLU participants will need to contribute a **tip** for our drivers, hotels, restaurants, and guides. All participants should bring an additional **\$80** in **cash** for this. Please bring this in US currency and have this ready to be collected upon arrival the first night at the SLU meeting.
- Some **bathroom facilities charge for use**, so you will need some **1 Euros** or change for this as the need arises.
- If you choose to have lunch not on the cruise ship but rather each while on excursion, then you will be responsible for the cost of your lunch. We encourage attendees to **plan for 2 lunches** at their expense.

# **General Questions**

## Do I need to bring a medical release form?

- Groups: Group leaders must bring a medical release form for any minors attending without a parent/ guardian and always keep them with you during the program. Medical Release forms must empower your group leader (not SLU) to authorize medical treatment for the students you are bringing to the program.
- Singles: Any student attending without a chaperone must complete the SLU Medical Release Form during the online registration process.

## Is there an emergency contact?

You may contact SLU at 407-248-0300, ext. 20, and a staff member will get the message to us as quickly as possible. We are constantly on the move at 401, and it is difficult to know whether we will have phone service at any given time. You may also leave a message at any of the hotels as shown on the itinerary, and they will contact us in our room or leave a message.

## How do you deal with discipline issues?

We are a premier leadership training organization, and we do not babysit. We operate on an honor system. Roommates are to hold each other accountable. Our standard rule is that a breach of conduct results in an immediate phone call to the parent and the student being sent home on the next available flight **at the expense of the parent.** Remember as you are traveling that you represent someone – your group, your family, your country, our Savior. Don't play into the typical tourist stereotype. Make sure you use wisdom in how you carry yourself and set an example.

## Are dietary restrictions or food allergies able to be met on 401?

If you have special dietary restrictions or food allergies, they must be submitted to SLU at the time of registration. If something comes up after registration, you can update your registration information up to 90 days before departure by <u>clicking here</u>. Please be sure to offer specifics on what you cannot eat and what can be substituted. We will make every effort to accommodate, but there may be certain times when this is not possible. We strongly recommend that you bring prepared foods or snacks with you that are compliant with your dietary needs since not all dietary restrictions can be accommodated while traveling internationally.

## What if I have special medical needs?

SLU is not equipped to provide medical assistance such as injections, etc. Please send a detailed explanation by email to <a href="mailto:nikki@slulead.com">nikki@slulead.com</a> of your medical condition and needs so that we can assess whether we can assist you. It is the responsibility of the individuals to contact SLU prior to registration concerning any specific medical issues. Always pack a backup of medications in case one is lost and bring the names of your prescriptions, and the doctor's contact information.

#### Do I need shots or vaccinations?

Typically, you do not need specific vaccinations. However, a Tetanus shot within the last five years is highly recommended.

## Do I need to bring any medications?

If you are taking prescription or over-the-counter medications, be sure to pack enough to last your entire trip, as well as a little extra in the event of unexpected delays. Carry each medication in its original container with the label and pack it in your carry-on bag. Traveler's diarrhea and/or upset stomach are the most common conditions for travels. It is recommended to bring Imodium AD and/or chewable Pepto Bismol tablets.

#### What should I be doing right now to prepare for the trip?

We will send you a "pre-trip" briefing one month before departure, but here is a sneak peek of some things you can be doing in advance to prepare for this great adventure:

- Be prepared! Spiritually, focus on the Great Commandment and pray for a deep love for our Lord and the ability to express who He is.
- Check out our <u>recommended reading list</u>.
- As we will literally be walking through Scripture during the trip, read the book of Acts to focus on the Journeys of Paul (specifically Acts 13-20), the 12 books of History in the Old Testament (Joshua – Esther) and the 4 Gospels in the New Testament (Matthew – John).

### What can I expect from SLU prior to the trip?

## **SLU 401 Packing Suggestions Check List**

Since this conference packet is full of suggestions on what you need at SLU 401, here is a summary list, so you have everything in one place. Make sure you read the entire conference packet, so you don't miss any details.

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- Your sense of adventure and flexible attitude
- Suitcase (bring a larger one if you plan on getting a lot of souvenirs)
- ☐ Small bag to carry things on the bus with you that can also be comfortable to wear while out in the hot sun to hold water and snacks.
- Passport and Xerox copy of your passport
- Casual clothes that follow dress guidelines keep it comfortable and simple
- Modest one-piece bathing suit for ladies
- Good shoes you can walk/ hike in (make sure you break these shoes in before the trip). Also, you want to make sure your shoes have a good grip on the bottom for walking.
- Bible (We suggest a Bible with room for notes and not a small travel bible. You will want to mark in your Bible the day we are at certain places in Scripture. It is really cool to look back on this.)
- Pen/ highlighters
- Sunscreen and toiletries
- \$80 tip money in US currency to give to SLU staff upon arrival for drivers and guides
- Bathing suit- there is a pool on the cruise ship
- Sunglasses and good sun/ hiking hat that covers your neck
- Rain Jacket We will tour rain or shine so be prepared
- Power Adapter this will be sent to you in your preconference packet from our partners
- ☐ Euros US Dollars are not widely accepted in Greece
- All Medicines (including copies of prescriptions), plus it is also a good idea to pack a small medical kit with items like band-aids, sleep aids for the plane, and medicine for headaches or nausea (Imodium).

- Travel alarm clock/ watch

- Optional: ear buds to use with the guides instead of having to use the headphones provided (needs to be the old plug-ins not new iPhone plugs)
- Plastic bags for wet or dirty clothes
